





### **GENERAL SESSION (10:00AM - 10:50AM)**

#### January 8th - Stuart Hair, Director of Commercial & Community Engagement **Charlotte Douglas International Airport**

An update on Charlotte Douglas International Airport, one of the world's busiest airports and an economic engine for the Carolinas. As the Charlotte region has grown, the Airport continues to develop and enhance the experience for the traveling public. A behind the scenes look at the current construction projects, future plans, and tips for travelers.

January 22nd - Kristine Arnau, Age-Friendly Program Coordinator Mecklenburg County's Department of Social Services - Equitable Aging Kristine Arnau will discuss Age-Friendly Mecklenburg, a collective planning effort to improve quality of life for older adults. This initiative community-wide collaborative is guided by the 8 Domains of Livability framework established by the AARP and World Health Organization (WHO). Our efforts are guided by community organizations and residents to address the unique needs of aging residents throughout Mecklenburg County.

Join other All members for a casual discussion about current events — from happenings in Charlotte to around the globe. No particular viewpoint is required, just an open mind, curiosity and a friendly spirit. Classmates may join the conversation or just listen in. News articles, studies and illustrations from multiple sources will be the basis for discussion. Instructor: Andy Beary

Photo Management Class: ABCs of photo organization (How can a photo manager help? The basics of why gathering, sorting, organizing, and digitizing gives us the ability to enjoy our photos again). Creating a family timeline (Learn how to create a family timeline as one of the first steps in sorting photos - can make a timeline of your life, where you have lived, significant dates from your life.). Your treasures have a story (What are these items - memorabilia, furniture, antiques, something special to you - how do you pass on the story associated with these things?). Outdated media (What do I do to enjoy these again? Bring these out of closets, drawers, under beds and have them converted to a format where you can relive, enjoy and share.). Legacy (What stories do I want to leave behind? Providing questions to help with telling part of our story, what do we want to pass on and leave behind?). Let's write a bit of our story (Bring several photos and actually spend some class time writing about them and coming up with a plan to have a platform to share with family this class would also have time for any questions from the class.)
